FY 20-21 Full Year of Operation

Progress has been steady despite the dampening effect of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Namadhenu

Namadhenu continues to be everpopular, attracting a new crop of donors. We have an easy instalment scheme to help devotees do Namas over a period of time.

Growing Community

Our congregation is growing, and the communities we are serving are expanding significantly.

Flagship Event - Srinivasa Kalyanam

Our flagship event Srinivasa Kalyanam attracted a record total of over 525 devotees at the Petone Hall, including a bus-load of devotees from Palmerston North. The event was a grand success and contributed over \$12k to the temple funds.

Year Highlights

- We restarted after COVID lockdown on 1st June 2020
- Re-established our volunteer priests and family roster
- We engaged professional cleaners to ensure the Health & Safety of all our devotees and volunteers
- We have invested in virtual online technology & tool; We have livestreamed most of the temple events via Facebook
- We have suspended Cafeteria services due to COVID, but our fundraising events have continued with the support of a large number of volunteers.
- Our service performance statement is attached to the Annual Report, which details the activities.

- Continue educational services VSN classes, Telugu Patashala etc

Our Financial Position

We are in a good financial position



2019 - Property acquired on the strength of 168K in Namadhenu



2020 - Powered by another 68K with Namas, we reached an Equity of over 300K



2021 - With continued Namas (\$55k) and all round activity, we have grown our equity to over \$400K



\$240K in BNZ Term Deposits & earned over 2K in interest.



We collected under \$2k for India Covid Relief & passed it on to Oxfam Aotearoa for use in India Covid Relief.




We have renewed the Rental agreement with our long-time tenant for two years with a reasonable increase in rent.

Our plan in the next 2 years is to consolidate financially and consult the community on the future Temple Build.


